If you haven't had your programme committee meeting contact course coordinator</p> <p>NStEP- The National Student Engagement Programme, known as NStEP, will be running its Introductory Class Rep Training for reps at TU Dublin SU! This training is designed to introduce key concepts and practical skills to help you succeed in the role. Over 1000 reps have already participated in this training across Ireland so far this year, and 99% say they would recommend it to other reps!</p> <p>Training covers four key areas:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Student engagement and partnership in the context of the class rep role 2. The Student Learning Experience tool, and how it can be used to gather and evaluate feedback from your class 3. The class rep feedback cycle 4. Strategies for communicating feedback effectively <p>There are limited slots so get your Eventbrite before all the spots are taken. Happening this Thursday and Friday with 3 sessions each day but all sessions are the same so you'll have to attend one. Trish will send out links to Eventbrite tickets as soon as the meeting has concluded.</p> <p>National Forums for Teaching and Learning Teaching Heroes Awards</p> <p>The Teaching Hero Awards are Ireland's only national, student-led awards for all those who teach in higher education.</p> <p>The Awards are organised by the National Forum in collaboration with the Union of Students in Ireland and other students' unions nationwide. They provide an opportunity for students across the country to recognise and celebrate outstanding teaching in our higher education institutions. Teaching Heroes are nominated by individual students, who submit a short personal piece (a maximum of 150 words) that explains why the person is their 'Teaching Hero'.
