<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exam Timetables <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - DT353 had four days of exams without breaks in between. VP Education explained that timetables are difficult to arrange as it involves coordination between the various locations and number of students per class etc. VP Education asked rep for DT353 whether they had had a Programme Committee Meeting yet – they have not and so asked to contact their Programme Chair. • Class Timetables <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - DT353: moving classrooms. CO confirmed that this happens. - Changing timetables. One class has two lecturers on a Friday and the class have asked the Class Rep to see if it can be changed. Class Rep spoke with their Programme Chair/School. However, the class is unhappy it cannot be changed. CO advised Class Rep to mention to the class that if they contact the School as a group it may help to demonstrate the class' desire to change the timetable. • Group projects <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It was asked whether it was common for students in a group to receive the same grade. VP Education and VP Welfare advised to look at the Module Descriptor for the assessment breakdown. If the Module Descriptor notes that the grade is not individual for group projects it would be very difficult to change. Class Rep noted difficulty in raising issue with lecturer. Advised to raise issue with their Programme Chair. - Asked to clarify role of Head of School. VP Education explained the various roles within a School: Lecturers, Programme Chair, Asst. Head of School, Head of School. • Class Rep Networking Event 2020 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - February 12th in Token. • SU Referendum <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - VP Welfare provided details; it is a vote to amend the current constitution. The new constitution includes the new College Officer roles and other amendments. Voting takes place on February 19th and 20th across the various campuses.
