No one is allowed to use equipment in the college. They have a lot of practical classes but are unable to use required equipment as practical classes are being done online. Students are not getting practical experience. Student services are getting through the back log, but they will be posted out to you shortly.</p> <p>Printers – North House can still be accessed for using printers.</p> <p>Student Hoodies – Will update students on social media when these become available for ordering.</p> <p>Has there been a discussion regarding refunding or cancelling contribution fees for this year? We the union believe that education should be free, even without a pandemic. We pay the highest fees in Europe. Its not going to be TU Dublin who decide this, it is the government who decides this. This is a long-term issue. Education for All is a Country wide campaign on access to education run by the Union of Students in Ireland alongside colleges across the country. TU Dublin SU are taking part in the lobbying efforts and emailing and tweeting all of our local TDs.
