Background

Each year TU Dublin Students' Union conduct a Class Representative Survey in order to gauge Rep feedback on a number of issues at the time as well as our service delivery. The Class Rep Survey for 2023 took place from the 6th to the 20th of March 2023. The Survey was sent to all of our current Class Representatives across all five faculties in TU Dublin.

Survey Information

Of the **809** Class Reps currently elected, **204** responded to our survey, representing **25%** of all Class Reps. Each respondent took an average of **04:22 minutes** to complete the survey. The results contain both quantitative and qualitative feedback which has been sorted into relevant categories and summarized below for your information.




Question 1: I am clear about what is expected of me as a Class Rep.




Question 2: I know who to contact in my department/School if my class has a problem.



Question 3: I was informed in advance about the Programme Committee Meeting in semester 1.






Question 4: I was able to attend the Programme Committee meeting.





Question 5: If not, why?




Question 6: I was able to raise issues and queries at the meeting.

Question 7: Feedback provided on our performance in the semester 1 Exams has been effective.






Question 8: Feedback provided to my class on semester 1 continuous assessment (assignments, projects, practical's etc) has been effective.

Question 9: Our teaching/lecturing is being delivered:






Question 10: My module is being delivered as advertised? (e.g. delivered online when advertised as online)






Question 11: The academic staff are accessible to students who have queries or concerns about their learning.




Question 12: I know who to contact in the Students' Union if I have a query about sorting problems on my course.





Question 13: Class Rep Meetings are a useful way to get information on college and TUDSU activities.






Question 14: The day/time of the Class Rep Meetings suit me.





Question 15: I would attend Class Rep Meetings in the evening after 5pm.





Question 16: I find Class Rep Meetings beneficial, and I can raise issues and concerns with my SU officers.






Question 17: I feel like a valued member of the Students' Union Team.

Question 19: Did you attend the in-person overnight training in Semester 1?




Question 20: I found the in-person overnight training in Semester 1 beneficial.

Question 24: Is there anything you think should be added to the 'Our Student Voice' Training that could help you in your role?

The majority of Class Reps (96 Reps) who responded to this question felt that there were no changes needed to the training that they found it to be very useful.

Here are the suggested changes that were noted:

'Badges'

'Explanations of TU Dublin structure to help know who to go to directly'

'What to do if the members of the school such as lecturers or programme chairs are not responsive and or are combative.'

'It should be noted that evening part-time students have different attitudes to the fulltime day students.'

'How to coordinate group stuff like hoodies and class events.'

Question 25: What is the most effective way for the Students' Union to Communicate with you?

Of the 203 respondents to this question by far the most popular form of communication was via **Email** with **158 (77%)** responses.

The next most popular response was communication through meetings/in-person which received 31 (15%) responses. Social Media was noted by 12 (6%) respondents with 11 (5%) suggesting WhatsApp. That was closely followed by 10 (5%) respondents noting that Text Message was the most beneficial for them.

Other notable suggestions were a request for 'more detailed emails' and the establishment of a '<u>Discord Server</u>' for Class Reps.
