#### **Key Points Since Last Meeting**

<u>Training:</u> Training began on July 1<sup>st</sup> until the beginning of August. Training included SafeTalk, Anti-Bias Anti-Racism workshop with Black and Irish, disclosure, tours of all campuses, information about TUDSU, information about our roles, GDPR training and much more.

<u>Comms Week</u>: Comms week was a week of essentially planning the year in August, we also assigned mandates and policies to each member of the team and planned for upcoming campaigns and determined which officer is taking the lead on what.

<u>USI</u>: We went to SUT (Student Union Training) in July from the 11-14th in Dundalk's DkIT, where additional training was provided on our roles, workshops and we made connections with other SU's around the country, giving us a chance to exchange ideas or get connections. SUT+ was more training and workshops and the first National council was held at the end of August. I didn't attend SUT+ as we had our first campaign and I stayed back in Dublin to run it.

<u>Supplemental Exams campaign:</u> This was ran in August for students sitting repeats/deferral exams. We wrote articles about Burnouts and the different between Stress vs Burnout and also wrote about how to manage your wellbeing during exam periods. We gave out free red bull and nature valley bars and some merchandise like pens, lanyards, copies. We also implemented a 'rent a calculator' where we lent calculators to students who may not have one or forgot one and we recorded their name and student number to keep track of the calculators. The education team also waived fees for these exams which was a huge relief for students!

Spill da T: Every Tuesday we run a 'Spill da T' common room event across all common rooms on all campuses from 12.30-1.30, where we offer free tea and coffee to students and every week there is a new activity. This is to urge students to come to our common rooms more and let them meet their SU officers for either a formal or informal chat! Sometimes the activities can be linked in with whatever event we have going on that week, such as for the week of the Student Walkout we had the activity be poster making, and for Mental Health Week it was speed ranting and mindfulness colouring.

<u>Freshers:</u> This year, the VP for events and engagement suggested we run a freshers fortnight to give all students the chance to meet each other properly and socialise as COVID had an impact on all years and all students. It was ran well on all campuses, with some minor obstacles with the Shack, but both the team and the Shack rectified this obstacle. The day time activities seemed to be a huge hit with students.

Mental Health week: Mental health week was ran and included gentle activities such as 'Write one Take one' where students wrote something positive on a sticky note and left it, while taking another someone else wrote. We had such positive feedback from students regarding this in particular. An SU issue arose on the Monday when 'Write one Take One; was to take place but we worked hard to implement this into the rest of the week. It didn't go as well as I would've liked as any events I wanted to host wouldn't respond to me, but overall it worked pretty well with what we done.

<u>Accommodation Sleep Out protest:</u> This was lead by our Welfare and Equality team and included sleeping out in an attempt to raise awareness to both the accommodation crisis and homelessness. I was sick so couldn't attend myself, but students seemed to really enjoy it and from what I've heard, was all positive.

Student Walkout: The national student walkout was proposed by UCC and passed, where it was held on October 13<sup>th</sup>. The deputy of city campus arranged it across all 3 campuses. All officers took part in banner making and carrying out the walkout. The Tallaght Echo interviewed the deputy of Tallaght campus too and took some photographs of our Tallaght officers and students. At 11:11am we had about 200/300 Tallaght students leave their class and we protested at the main entrance of the college. The walkout was short and sweet and lasted 45 minutes at max but the students were really passionate and we definitely delivered a powerful message to the government, and it's only the beginning.

Evacuation social media campaign collaboration with TUD Health, Safety and Welfare: The welfare and equality vice presidents met with Health Safety and Welfare and together we filmed an evacuation social media campaign. It included all of the steps to take if there's a fire/fire alarm. We launched it prior to orientations. We put a fun twist on it so students would watch and engage with it including a sneak peak video of our bloopers, but we were still mindful it's a serious issue and made it as serious as possible with a light hearted element of the blooper reel.

Orientations: On the Tallaght Campus, the SU were heavily involved with Erasmus student orientations, Mature student orientations, Access student orientations and first year orientations. Some issues arose regarding first year orientations in that some students while on a tour didn't see the SU building (at no fault of the student leaders who done an incredible job!) and the two rooms used for orientation were separate due to the large volume of students, so the deputy of the Tallaght campus, the vp for education on the Tallaght campus and I had to split our orientation talks as they were simultaneous and didn't get to carry them out together as a 3, but we raised these issues with TUD staff and we are involved with them in making orientations for next years first years better!
