USI:

So a whole lot to do with USI has happened since last Student Council so I'll try break this down as best as I can:

- We attended NC in Galway from the 23rd and 24th of February. The main agenda for that NC was to have motions ready to be sent for Comhdháil (which I will get to later).
- USI had a lobby day on the 2nd of March in the Buswells Hotel, Co. Dublin. about the cost of college. Myself and Louise attended the day and were met with many TDs in opposition and highlighted the many issues that students are currently facing in third level education.
- In between the lead up to Comhdháil was the USI Elections. While I was a candidate in the race, myself and the team had spoke with some other candidates for USI and questioned them on their manifesto points and what they wished to bring to the national level. TUDSU had their hustings for USI on the 22nd of March in Grangegorman where all the candidates presented themselves and all of you voted for who we wished to elect for the incoming year (also thank you to everyone who voted for me <3)
- Comhdháil took place from the 3rd 6th of April in the Clayton Hotel, Co. Sligo. TUDSU brought 30 people to represent our students. The amount of motions that we proposed and spoke for and against on are endless so I won't go through all of it in this report but everyone who went to Comhdháil spoke incredibly well and leaves me with high hopes that students will stay involved in the student movement on national level.
- The next NC will be 11th and 12th of May in DCU. Any motions that got 9D'd from Comhdháil will be brought up during the working groups where they will be able to amend the motions to be brought to the next, and final, NC which will be in UCC (which will include the incoming teams from all of the other MOs and me stepping into USI).

The 7th of March we promoted the Piper Seisún that was happening in the Cobblestone, the 8th of March we had the movie night in Grá bar where we screened An Cailín Ciúin, and on the 9th of March was to be the Irish Bingo that was happening in the Woolshed. Unfortunately, the interest in these events were very low, with the movie night only having 3 people and the bingo having to be cancelled due to low numbers. A lot of the reasons why people weren't interest was due to the time of the year (a lot of assignments before the week off) and the events being on in the evening instead of during the day. I'm glad we did make an attempt at running SnaG this year, and I'm very thankful to the team, the students and USI Leas-Uachtarán don Gaeilge for helping me giving me ideas and putting together the campaign. I hope our new PTO for Gaeilge will be able to keep the passion there and to hold the incoming team to speak more Irish and incorporate it more into everything that we do.
